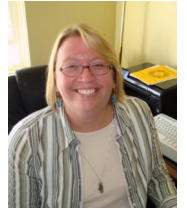
These are the wrong questions to ask. They are questions of worry and fear that come from a place of scarcity.

These are probing, not easily answerable questions. Questions that take time, thought, doubt and faith. They need to go with us on solitary walks, in the car, on the bike, in the shower, after we've put the children to bed, while we're quietly preparing dinner, even into our workplace. They need to sit and steep with us for a long time.

Our Stewardship Board has done an excellent job of preparing materials for us to think deliberately and intentionally about what it means to be good stewards of our faith, and how we carry out that faith at First Congregational Church. **It is essential for all of us to take some time with these materials**, to reflect prayerfully and intentionally about how we experience God's abundance in our lives and how that abundance inspires us to support this community of faith. How will our souls be nurtured in the future

- We have a number of smaller diaper drives scheduled for October at local preschools and other organizations. We'll report back on these next month!

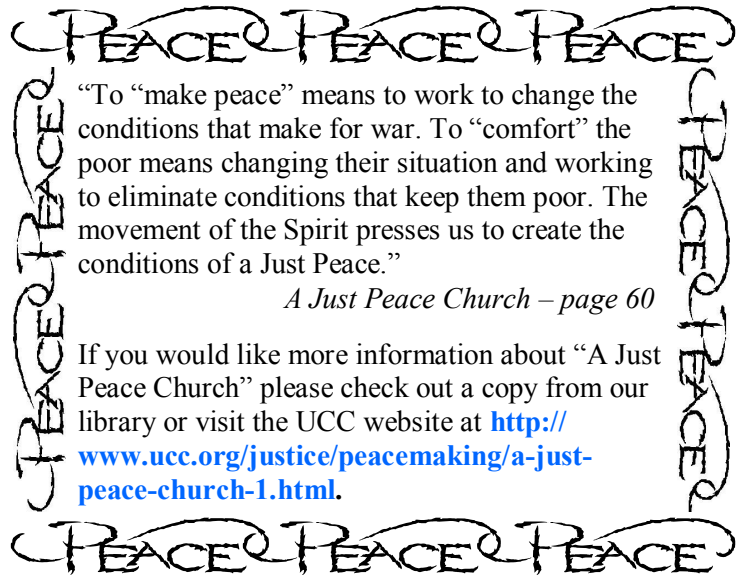
